


Claims Services, the Judgment Administrator designated by Plaintiffs' Class Counsel and approved by the Court. The Judgment Administrator shall perform its functions under the supervision of Class Special Masters and shall timely and properly file or cause to be filed on a timely basis all tax returns necessary or advisable with respect to the qualified settlement fund (including without limitation all income tax returns, all informational returns, and all returns described in Treas. Reg. §1.468B-2(1)). The Court shall retain continuing jurisdiction over the administration and distribution of the "Wal-Mart Pennsylvania Class Action Account." The Court shall act through supervision of Andrew A. Chirls and S. David Fineman, of the law firm of Fineman, Krekstein & Harris, P.C., Ten Penn Center Plaza, 1801 Market Street, Suite 1100, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania 19103, who are hereby appointed Class Special Masters to act in accordance with this Court's Order of Distribution.

In accordance with the mandate of the Superior Court, this Court shall retain exclusive jurisdiction to determine and award statutory and common fund attorney fees and post-trial expenses. In accordance with Pa. R. Civ. P. 1716, the Court shall also retain exclusive jurisdiction to determine and approve a distribution plan and to oversee the Class Judgment administration and all related matters. Any pension component arising from the distribution to Class members herein has been conclusively resolved by separate litigation, *King, et al. v. Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., et al.*, 2:07-cv-01486-WY (D. Nev. Final Judgment entered Oct. 29, 2009 in 2:06-cv-00225-PMP-PAL).
